**REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR  
NATIONAL CONSULTANT FOR EIF TIER 2 CEDEP II MID-TERM EVALUATION  
(REF: EIF/2015/030)  
(Output-based)**

1. In 2008, the Royal Government of Cambodia has established a Trade Sector-Wide Approach (Trade SWAp) under the leadership of the Ministry of Commerce (MoC) to manage and coordinate better the use and implementation of its Aid for Trade (AfT). Trade SWAp has three main strategic “Pillars”. Each pillar captures key indicative areas for reform and progress to support the development of Cambodia’s trade sector. Specially, Pillar 2 focuses on strengthening the export supply capacity of 19 potential sectors (products and services) identified in the Cambodia Trade Integration Strategy 2007 (CTIS 2007).
2. In February 2014, the finding of Cambodia’s Diagnostic Trade Integration Strategy (CTIS) and Trade SWAp Roadmap 2014-2018 was officially launched. This reflects efforts by the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) to take stock of important development in the country’s trade sector since the previous CTIS 2007 and to update Cambodia’s strategy and directions for trade integration into global and regional market. This CTIS 2014-2018 is mainly guided recommended by three principles: updating and strengthening Cambodia’s Trade SWAp, incorporating Government capacity built since 2007 to lead the updating of CTIS Trade SWAp Road Map, and identifying new challenges and incorporating new priorities for RGC for trade development into Trade SWAp.
3. Consequently, the Trade SWAp’s vision is the following: “In the next ten years, the RGC will be increasingly valued for its integrity, for its capacity to articulate and implement trade policies and strategies in consultation with all trade stakeholders and for its ability to enforce trade regulations aiming at strengthening competitiveness in existing export industries and at promoting export diversification”. The vision will be pursued by maximizing the benefit of AfT and enhancing policy dialogue with the private sector, civil society and development partners.
4. The main purpose of this consultancy services is to help the Ministry of Commerce to carry out a comprehensive analysis of the efficiency, effectiveness and potential impact of CEDEP II after 18 months (mid-term-August 2015) in order to define ways and means to improve its implementation to reach its stated objective of trade diversification and expansion.
5. For that purpose, the Ministry of Commerce is seeking the support of **one** individual **National Consultant** to conduct Cambodia’s mid-term evaluation in line with OECD/DAC evaluation criteria and the recommendations of the EIF/ES<sup>1</sup> the effectiveness of the current Trade SWAp structure and implementation and make recommendations on ways and means to improve its efficiency.
6. The Consultant will be based in DICO, MoC (DICO is acting as the Trade SWAp Secretariat, National Implementation Unit of the EIF and Executive Agency of the Trade Development Support Programme). She/he will work under the general direct supervision and guidance of the EIF Focal Point and in collaboration with the NIU Director and the EIF Program Manager (EIF PM). The consultant’s assignment is expected to be for a maximum of 20 (twenty) working days, all of them in-country of Cambodia. There is no international travel involved as part of this assignment.

7. Qualifications to be quantitatively evaluated (scored):
- Master Degree in International Trade, International Economics or Development Studies.
  - At least 8 years of relevant professional work experience in monitoring and evaluation works;
  - Proven experience in developing and evaluating strategies, programme and project documents in the context of trade-related technical assistance projects and programmes, with strong focus on Aid Effectiveness;
  - Sound knowledge in trade development issues and aid-for-trade, such as previous training delivered, records of publications, etc.;
  - Proven experience in working with Government and networking with national and international stakeholders, preferably in Asian LDCs in the area of trade mainstreaming and trade related technical assistance;
  - Familiarity with donor agencies procedures, Monitoring and Evaluation practices and in the use of basket funds, trust funds and budget support for development projects; and
  - Proficiency in written and spoken English.
8. The national consultant should work with the international consultant to conduct an independent evaluation of Cambodia's CEDEP II project, during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2015. The final report shall be delivered before 30, November 2015.

Interested consultants must provide their updated curriculum vitae, indicating personal and technical skills, academic qualifications, experience in similar assignments, and experience in Cambodia and/or other developing countries along with the names of at least three (3) referees with contact information (e-mail address, telephone or fax numbers). Expressions of Interest shall be submitted in hard copy followed by an electronic copy.
