**REQUEST FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST**  
**FOR NATIONAL TECHNICAL CONSULTANT ON ANTI-DUMPING**  
**(REF. TDSP/2014/100)**

1. The Kingdom of Cambodia has received financing in the amount of approximately US\$ 15.45 million equivalent, from the Multi Donor Trust Fund, contributed by the European Commission, DANIDA and UNIDO. The fund will be managed by the World Bank as “trustee” to support the “Trade Development Support Program (TDSP)” with the Department of International Cooperation (DICO) of the Ministry of Commerce as the Executing Agency in coordination with other line ministries and stakeholders. The Ministry intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments for goods, works, related services and consulting services to be procured under this project.
2. The Trade SWAp combines the activities of many individual donors within three separate pillars: Pillar 1 for cross-cutting reforms, Pillar 2 for sectorial initiatives and Pillar 3 for capacity building. Many activities that take place within the trade SWAp overlap with each other and therefore the division between pillars is sometimes arbitrary. Guidelines have been put together by the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) to organize the various activities taking place in each of the three Pillars of the Trade SWAp, which guidelines are referred to as the Pillar Roadmaps.
3. The DICO, serving as Secretariat to the TDSP, is recruiting an **National Technical Consultant on Anti-Dumping** who will be work under Department of Notifications and Legal Compliance (D/NLC) of the Ministry of Commerce, in his role the **National Technical Consultant on Anti-Dumping** to assist in the preparation of procedures manuals for conducting anti-dumping and safeguards investigations and provide logistical and organizational support to the international experts preparing the manuals and to D/NLC, in particular as regards the organization of workshops and the monitoring of progress. The positions of **National Technical Consultant on Anti-Dumping** require a person of particular experience, integrity and knowledge:
  - At least Bachelor’s degree in law or business.
  - Prior experience in supporting project activities funded by development partners.
  - Experience working in trade related projects under the World Bank or Asian Development Bank for at least 2 years.
  - Good inter-personal skill
  - Experience working with Government institutions
  - Fluency in written and spoken English.

4. The **National Technical Consultant on Anti-Dumping** is expected to conduct the assigned tasks over a period of **6 months**. The Consultant is required to submit the following outputs to the Director of D/NLC.

DICO invites expressions of interest from qualified and experienced individual candidates to undertake the above mentioned services which are further detailed in the Terms of Reference for this assignment. The successful candidate will be selected in accordance with the provisions of Section II, under the World Bank's Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants by World Bank Borrowers, January 2011.
6. In submitting their expressions of interest, candidates are kindly requested to indicate the following reference (Ref. TDSP/2014/100). Interested candidates must provide their updated curriculum vitae, indicating personal and technical skills, academic qualifications, experience in similar assignments, and experience in Cambodia and/or other developing countries along with the names of at least three (3) referees with contact information (e-mail address, telephone or fax numbers). Expressions of Interest may be submitted electronically followed by the submission of a hard copy as well. If it is submitted in hard copy, candidates must also provide an electronic copy.
7. Candidates may obtain copies of the detailed Terms of Reference (in English) for the assignment from the address below during office hours from 7:30 to 11:30 and from 14:00 to 17:30 hours, Monday through Friday.
