Strategic Proposal for the Support of ASYCUDA World System

➤ **Single Administrative Document (SAD):**

- Referring to letter No. 90 dated 6 Dec 2005 of RGC, SAD is a single document that incorporates and contains all relevant information required by all concern ministries and agencies for imports and exports administration. CED is the leading agency for developing and managing the implementation of this document, for imports and exports procedures.
- *SAD was implemented on 1st January 2008* with the purpose of standardizing customs documents, harmonizing codification and simplifying procedures in international trade exchanges.

➤ **Automated System for Customs Data (ASYCUDA):**

- With financial support from the WB under TFCP, UNCTAD's ASYCUDA World (AW) system was selected to automate customs clearance procedures.
- Networking Equipment were donated from Huawei Company.
- Continuing support from the WB under TDSP.
- **Server Architecture:** Centralization Server & Disaster Recovery Site (DRS).
- **Geographical Coverage:** 22 Major Customs Offices
- **Implemented Functional Modules:**
 - Manifest function was implemented on 1st January 2012
 - Customs Bonded Warehouse function was implemented on 1st July 2012
 - Direct Trader Input (DTI) was implemented on 30th January 2013
 - SAD real-time processing status board was implemented on 01st June 2014
 - Online SAD status checking was implemented on 01st October 2014

➤ ASYCUDA Support under TDSP

- **GDCE and MOC signed MoU on 12 July 2012 (No.TDSP/2012/SP07)**
- **First extension:** MoU has been extended to **31 March 2015**
- The project comprises of 8 Components and 1 new Component as follows:
 - Component 1: extension of contract with a local company Resolvo (from 01 January to 31 March 2015 only 5 staffs reducing from 7 staffs) . From July 2015, 4 local IT consultants have been engaged to provide technical support.
 - Component 2: extension of contract with Viettel for the leasing of fiber optic service
 - Component 3: maintenance of IT equipment and power generators (**completed**)
 - Component 4: local IT to upgrade and enhance GDCE website (**completed**)
 - Component 5: support of the GDCE HQs AW office
 - Component 6: securing support from UNCTAD to upgrade the version of ASYCUDA
 - Component 7: capacity building for the national project team members (**completed**)
 - Component 8: international consultant service for collecting fee for sustainable operation (**cancelled**)
 - *Component 9 (new):* geographical expansion of the ASYCUDA to 10 additional sites

➤ **ASYCUDA Support under TDSP from April to December 2015**

- **Second extension:** MoU was extended from **April to December 2015** on the following selected components:
 - Component 1: extension of contract with a local company (open selection of individual consultants)
 - Component 2: extension of contract with Viettel for the supply and provision of fiber optic
 - Component 5: support of the GDCE HQs AW office.
 - Component 6: securing support from UNCTAD to upgrade the version of ASYCUDA (no cost extension)
 - Component 9: geographical expansion of the ASYCUDA

➤ **ASYCUDA Support under TDSP from December 2015 to March 2016**

- **Third extension:** MoU was extended from **December 2015 to March 2016** on the following components:
 - Component 1: contract with 4 national IT consultants to provide technical support.
 - Component 2: extension of contract with Viettel for the supply and provision of fiber optic
 - Component 5: support of the GDCE HQs AW office.
 - Component 6: securing support from UNCTAD to upgrade the version of ASYCUDA from April 2015 to March 2016 (no cost extension)
 - Component 9: geographical expansion of the ASYCUDA

➤ Request for IC Approval

Fourth extension from March to June 2016: on the following components:

- Component 1: contract with 4 national IT consultants to provide technical support. : \$30,000
- Component 2: extension of contract with Viettel for the supply and provision of fiber optic: \$52,000
- Component 5: support of the GDCE HQs AW office.
- Component 6: securing support from UNCTAD to upgrade the version of ASYCUDA (no cost extension)
- Component 9: geographical expansion of the ASYCUDA
- Procure SOClass Software support license from Strategy Object: \$38,000
- Replace servers, SAN storage, networking equipment and other related equipment (including DRS Site) which are in operation since 2008 and 2011.: \$200,000
- Total: 282,000 +38,000

➤ Current Status and Upcoming Activities

Current status: 51 offices are implementing the AW system.

Upcoming Activities:

- Geographical expansion to excise department and other offices.
- Improving some functionalities to web-base system.
- Develop new modules necessary.
- Upgrade ASYCUDA to the latest version from UNCTAD including:
 - Hotline and online support
 - Implement transit function
 - Validate manifest function and expand to other customs offices
 - Implement e-payment module
 - Enhance system performance
 - Fix some bugs and issues
 - Capacity building and training for national project team members₀
