3. Recommendations for new phase

To increase impact...

1. Align government strategies (NSDP, DTIS, Trade SWAp roadmaps)
2. Complementary activities
3. Sufficient activities under each goal... (Poverty goal)

To increase impact... (continued)

4. Engage private sector in activities ... or many targets won't be met
5. Bring all DPs working on trade under Trade SWAp (coordination and funding)
6. Sub-Steering Committee Meeting agenda to enter new phase

Before:
Meetings were procedural and focused on project administration

Future:

- Policy oriented
- Involve private sector
- Update on milestones
- Minister could ask for rapid response

Main messages

- Successful first two phases completed
- New phase “DELIVERING” requires:
 - Moving focus from process to policy
 - Ensuring link: activity – output – outcomes – goal
 - Involving all stakeholders
